## 26<sup>th</sup> SESSION OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL ITEM 6 UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW CAMBODIA Statement submitted by VIDES International – International Volunteerism Organization for Women, Education and Development (VIDES International) And co-sponsored by IIMA – Istituto Internazionale Maria Ausiliatrice

Mister President,

Thank you for giving us the floor.

VIDES International and IIMA commend Cambodia's acceptance of several UPR recommendations<sup>1</sup> concerning the right to education and ill treatment and sexual exploitation of children. Nevertheless, we note that further efforts are required to fully ensure children's rights.

With regard to the **right to education** for **children with disabilities**, we report that a high number of these children are still excluded from the education system, while many attending school face physical obstacles to educational facilities. Moreover, we welcome the acceptance of recommendations  $118.42^2$  and 118.64,<sup>3</sup> but we observe that human rights education is not included in school curricula or in teacher training.

Concerning **ill treatment and sexual exploitation of children**, we note with concern that sexual or domestic violence affects about 70% of children in Cambodia. Additionally, sex tourism and child prostitution are still common, especially in Siem Reap and coastal areas.

## Therefore, VIDES and IIMA call on Cambodia to:

- Promote and support inclusive education for children with disabilities and provide adequate facilities and assistance;
- Effectively implement relevant UPR recommendations<sup>4</sup> in order to include human rights education in school curricula and in teacher training; and increase human rights awareness through national campaigns;
- Initiate awareness-raising activities for parents and educators on alternative and nonviolent forms of discipline;
- Finally, fight against the sale and sexual exploitation of children.
